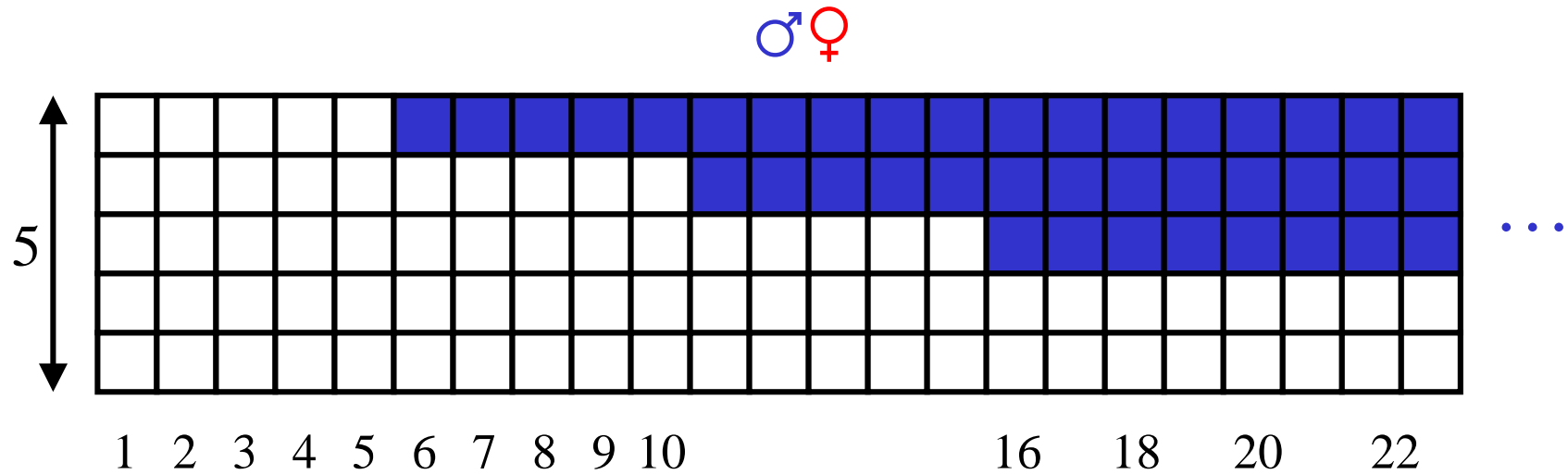
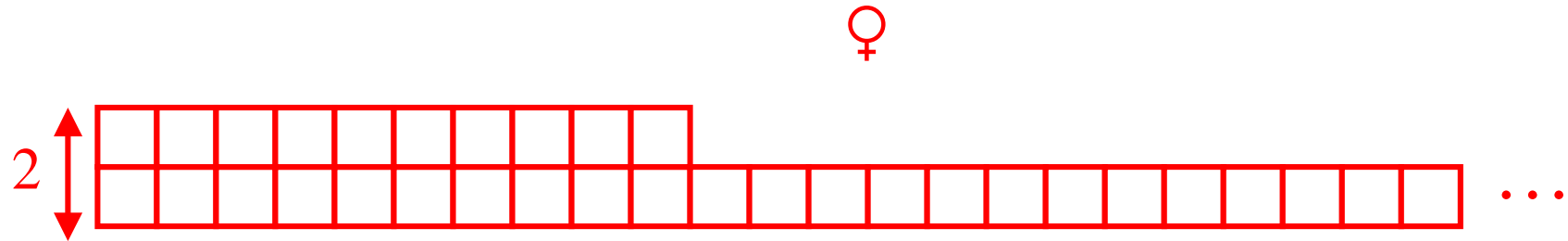


## Written in “Minutes of the meeting” CIVL 2000

# Special Requirements

## Pilot qualification requirements

In addition to the requirements of Section 7, Pilots must have either:

1. Finished in the top 2/3 of any PWC event
2. Have an FAI Eagle Gold Badge
3. Pilots failing to meet these criteria must produce a copy of their flight log book showing evidence of Gold Badge distance (100Km) and competition experience.
